



## **TERM LIMITS**

As promised during his campaign, Supervisor Foy came one step closer to passing meaningful ethics reform in Ventura County.

On May 8, 2007, Supervisor Foy presented the Ventura County Board of Supervisors with an ordinance he'd written that would limit county supervisors to three consecutive four-year terms in office. In addition, the ordinance would require that they wait a full four-year term before being eligible to serve again.

The Ventura County Board of Supervisors passed the term limits ordinance, and it will appear on the November 2008 ballot for voter approval.

"Term limits provide the residents of Ventura County with an opportunity to help solve issues because incumbency can be a very difficult thing to overcome," said Supervisor Foy. "With the ordinance on the ballot we give the people of Ventura County a choice."
